#### VIEW FROM THE EAST





#### **GREETINGS FROM THE SOUTH**

#### Stoicism

Stoicism is an ancient Greek philosophy founded by Zeno of Citium around 300 BCE. It teaches that true happiness comes from personal virtue and rationality, rather than external factors like wealth or fame. The philosophy emphasizes four cardinal virtues: wisdom, courage, justice, and temperance. By practicing self-control and fortitude, Stoics believe one can achieve a tranquil and fulfilling life.

Some of the most famous Stoic philosophers include:

- 1. **Zeno of Citium**: The founder of Stoicism, who began teaching in Athens around 300 BCE.
- 2. Cleanthes: Zeno's successor, known for his work on Stoic ethics and theology.



#### THE MASONIC HEART

From an early age, we modern humans are taught that the whole intellect and personality of man resides in the brain, that huge mass of neurological tissue that resides in our cranial cavities. We have automatically assumed that all of human experience, all that we think and feel resides in this cluster of neurons and nerve endings. However, our ancestors, those who lived and thought in the millennia prior to our existence, had a slightly different view of the emotional and logical seat of man and his thought processes.

The ancient Egyptians, those professional embalmers, made it a habit to remove all of the organs of the human beings who were mummified and place all of those organs but one in containers called "canopic jars." (As an aside, the term "canopic" derived from Greek stories of the Trojan Wars, describing the ship captain Canopus who was slain and buried in the Egyptian delta area in a jar!) But the actual practice of the Egyptian people was to place all of the unnecessary organs in containers separate from the body and return the most important organ, the heart, to the interior of the body where it belonged and could further guide the person through the afterlife.

The heart was considered of supreme importance to the ancient Egyptians, and was called the IB, the center of the mind, intelligence, and understanding. This was the innermost part of Man, which held his deepest loves and hates, and the gamut of his choices of good and evil. Thus, in the afterlife the heart itself was weighed on the scales of the goddess Ma'ahti, and the imbalance between good and evil choices determined the human's eternal placement in the worlds beyond. The physical brain, on the other hand, was disregarded and summarily discarded by the Egyptian mummifiers in this system of belief.

To the ancient Chinese people, the heart was considered the seat of intelligence, and of the mind. The word that they used for this concept was the XIN, which not only represented the concept of the beating heart pumping blood, but also the intellect of man.

The ancient Hindus, in the Atharva Veda text, described the heart as the link between the self, the soul, and intelligence. "This is my Soul in the innermost Heart, greater than the mid-region, greater than heaven."

Even the ancient Greeks believed that the heart was the center of emotion and desire; the seat of life itself. This was where Love was born. The famous Greek philosopher and physicist Aristotle firmly believed that the heart was the repository of the Soul.

There are so many more examples, not the least being the Biblical ones that Freemasonry draws from so heavily. Jeremiah 24:7, "I will give them a heart to know me, that I am the Lord"; Proverbs 3:5, "Trust in the Lord with all Your Heart"; Psalms 51:10, "Create in me a new heart, Oh God"; Proverbs 23:7, "as a man thinketh in his heart, so is he."




